Mental Disorders/Suicide

This monograph presents an analysis of statistical data on two important health problems, considered here as separate issues. Although systematic annual morbidity statistics for mental disorders are nonexistent, extensive data exist for the United States on patterns of use of mental hospitals and other types of psychiatric facilities. The chapters dealing with mental disorders examine these data and provide information for evaluating mental health services. The section on suicide provides mortality rates derived from data on all such deaths occurring in the United States, and discusses demographic variables as well as various sociological and psychological theories about suicide.
