THIS COMPETITION IS OPEN TO BOTH MEN AND WOMEN

One result of a current reorganization of the Division of Medical Services is the upgrading of hospital facilities for psychiatric care and an increase in the number of professional staff required. There is a present need for clinical psychiatrists who, in addition to normal clinical responsibilities will act as consultants to institutional directors in all matters relating to the mental health of inmates and participate with senior psychiatrists in the further development of treatment program for the mentally ill and for special groups of offenders. These progressive changes will be carried out in consultation with academic institutions.

These positions represent an opportunity to participate in the continuing development of a new approach to psychiatric services in the Canadian Penitentiary Service. Subsequent opportunities for promotion to senior positions are very good.

Positions are available in Quebec, Ontario, British Columbia and Saskatchewan with assistance in relocation being provided.

Salaries range up to \$30,400 (under negotiation) and there are many attractive fringe benefits.

Minimum qualifications for all positions would include a licence to practice medicine in a province of Canada with certification in psychiatry recognized in Canada by a statutory licensing body or possession of qualifications judged to be equivalent. For some positions, candidates must be qualified in the knowledge of both the English and French languages.
